Making a Difference

I'm eating with "Gilda"* at our evening meal one night. At 60 years old, short and plump, her head wrapped in a black scarf against the smooth brown skin of her face, she looks very much like one of the Italian grandmothers of her heritage and my own. She laughs regretfully when I ask her if she'd like to take a meal home with her. "I stay in my car,"



she says, "I haven't had a place to live for years." She says that sometimes she stays in a shelter but there are difficulties. She has to get there by late afternoon to try and get a bed for the night. And if there are more people waiting than beds available your name is put in a drawing. And you have to leave first thing in the morning and spend the day outside. After talking a while, it seems clear that Gilda's mental health has hindered her finding a home. She shares that she has some medical problems but does not want to go to the doctor because she's convinced that they anesthetized her and inserted a device into her wrist to track her movements. I find myself wishing there were more housing options available for people like Gilda, people who are lowincome and have more than the average number of challenges to find a safe, affordable place to call home. Bread of Life's Under One Roof project with Metro North Housing Corp will help fill that gap by providing fourteen secure, affordable studio apartments with paid onsite support staff. I can't wait until they're finished, and neither can people like Gilda.
